Maundy Thursday – 1st April

6.30pm *Seder Meal* via Zoom. A service order will be provided and packs will be delivered.

Please book in so we can prepare the packs in advance.

(The Passover Seder is a ritual feast that marks the beginning of the Jewish holiday of Passover. Some Christian theologians believe that it is this meal upon which Jesus' last supper was based. There are different elements to the meal - a plate with different foods and 4 cups of wine! We will use a simple *all age* prayerful service based around this meal and celebrate our fellowship and service to one another as we remember Jesus' last meal)

“*Watchnight of prayer*” - individuals can take time slots to pray at home guided by a prayer booklet.

Good Friday – 2nd April

Private Prayer with short talk as a focus. St George's church. There will be limited spaces that allow for arrival and departures in a Covid safe manner. **Booking essential** – choose one of the following slots:

Holy Saturday - 3rd April

12 noon – 1.30pm. *Private prayer* with music and a prayer booklet in All Saints Church. We use the time to remember that Resurrection cannot be rushed, that some places and people still live with the uncertainty and 'darkness' symbolised in this 'waiting' time.

8.00am - 8.35am. Outdoor lighting of the Easter fire and a simple said Communion service on the field. **Book your place!**

10.30am - 11.30am. Outdoor Easter Family Communion Service with hymns on the field.
