Run the Wall - 5K Community Run in Salisbury on 2nd March 2024.

The reason for this particular date is that it will coincide with the Palestine marathon taking place in Bethlehem. Because there is a separation wall in Bethlehem the Palestinians' movements are restricted, they do not have access to a 26-mile circuit, and the event has become known as Run the Wall. The charity Amos Trust has been supporting this event for the last few years, encouraging people around the world to run at the same time wherever they are. So we're running in solidarity with the Palestinians and it's a call for human rights. You can become involved in several ways:



- Running or walking either wherever you usually like to run/ walk (e.g. Parkrun) or we would be delighted if you choose to join a group of us at Hudson Field at 10.30am.
