#### Spring is in the Air

#### Church Electoral Roll

This year the Electoral Roll is totally new. Fill in the form online or in the churches. Joining the electoral roll can confirm your commitment to the Parish community and to our vision. It means that you can vote on any relevant issues at the annual parochial church meeting (APCM) and stand for election to the PCC (the church council). It also allows you to take part in the life of the wider Church of England, at deanery, diocese and even national levels, if you're interested. It is the closest thing the Church of England has to official membership, as well as by coming regularly to Harnham Worship and participating in the life of the church, and that would be your reason for being on the electoral roll.

To apply for the church electoral roll, you must:

- be 16 years old or over (although you can apply in the year you become 16 and you can be on the electoral roll once your birthday has passed)
- be baptised
- either live in the parish or have attended the church regularly for at least 6 months

The deadline for applications 1 May 2025. We will keep your information secure in line with UK GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation) regulations. We will be asking for more information to enable us to serve you better...

#### Where did your Easter egg come from?

Your Easter egg can be traced back to the early Church in Mesopotamia.

Since ancient times, people had been giving each other eggs at pagan Spring festivals, as eggs were a symbol of the new life and rebirth in nature all around them. Then came Jesus and His death and resurrection, which made Easter the ultimate time for Christians to celebrate new life and rebirth. After that, it was only a matter of time before eggs found their way into commemorating Easter.

This seems to have first happened with the very early church in Mesopotamia, where those early Christians began dyeing their eggs after Easter, to celebrate the new birth that Jesus had given to them. The practise of using eggs in Easter celebrations then spread to the Orthodox Churches, and from there to the Western Churches across Europe.

We would like to introduce ourselves as the local Neighbourhood Policing team for Harnham and the surrounding areas. For those of you who may not know us, our names are PC 0390 Hannah Cranham and PCSO 70486 Charlotte King.

We are hoping to use this platform to provide updates and advice regarding the local area. For April's edition we are sharing some prevention techniques about distraction burglaries.

Distraction burglars will pretend to be someone they are not, so it's important you are aware of the common methods they will use to get you to let them into your property

- Pretending to be from a care agency, the council or a utility company investigating a gas or water leak
- Seeking help to leave a note for a neighbour or even asking for a drink of water if they claim to be thirsty or unwell
- Working in teams, with one person distracting you while the other searches your home

You would think that it would be best to make a property less visible from the street, and to keep it hidden from prying eyes behind overgrown bushes, trees, high fences or walls. In reality, all that this serves to do is make it easier for a burglar to get close to a home unnoticed, and provide somewhere to hide while carrying out a burglary or theft from the property.

Recently Salisbury and District Organists' Association members visited the church to see the recently renovated Father Willis organ. Many members went and learnt the history of the instrument and were allowed about 5 minutes each to try it out. The sound was like that of the Father Willis organ in the cathedral and it brought the builder's characteristics to mind. Organs in their particular buildings can be a "Sound" and the five arched east window can be a sight or "Seeing" as it explained in the brochure.

Local charity Alabaré provides support and accommodation for people who are vulnerable, homeless or at risk of becoming homeless across Wiltshire and the South West but together we can all respond to the homelessness crisis.

People often ask us what they should do when they see a homeless person on the street. There isn't a simple answer, but here are some suggestions:

#### Approach with compassion

Say hello and ask if they would like any help, avoiding assumptions about their situation, but listening to their story.

Offer essentials like food, water or warm clothing, especially in cold weather. Retail vouchers or care packs with socks, gloves, and hygiene items are also thoughtful options.

#### Refer them to support partners

Let them know about Alabaré. We have a drop-in service in Salisbury and our website, www alabare.co.uk/need-help/ offers useful links.

Encourage them to contact the Local Authority, Rough Sleeper or Homelessness Team or refer them to www.StreetLink.org.uk

Call 999 if they are in immediate danger, need medical assistance, are vulnerable or appear to be under 18 years of age.

#### Other methods of support

- Donate to Alabaré and help ensure we can provide vital services and life -skills programmes.
- Volunteer with Alabaré and provide direct help. We have options and locations to suit everyone.



#### HIKE FOR HOPE

from John O'Groats to Salisbury,

Bruce Carter is in his fifties, self-employed in property maintenance, living with his wife Pip in Salisbury and part of the serving team at Salisbury Cathedral. Increasingly drawn to identify with the suffering of the Palestinian people in recent years, and having encountered Action around Bethlehem Children with Disability (ABCD) at Greenbelt Festival, he decided to make this Lenten Pilgrimage. He will Hike for Hope from John O'Groats to his home town Salisbury to raise money for the rehabilitation of injured and traumatised children in the Gaza Strip.

#### Bruce's motivation for the walk

Over the last 2-3 years at Greenbelt, we have listened to talks about life in Palestine. The speakers often say the only way to understand what life is like for them is to 'Come and see' so I planned to visit, but since 7<sup>th</sup> October 2023 it has obviously become more unlikely that I'd ever be able to get to Palestine. I had planned to take time off work during Lent 2025, and I had thought that if I couldn't go to Palestine then I would use that time to do something else — maybe raise money or work for a charity involved in Palestine. These last two years at Greenbelt we've got to know the volunteers who run a stand for ABCD; and this year I decided that I would use my time to do something for this charity.

The idea for a walk came to me when I recalled a book that I had read during Lent one year. The author Trystan Owen Hughes talked about the etymology of the word to 'saunter' and discussed the idea of walking through the world and seeing God's presence all around us. Since lockdown I have done a few long walks, and I wondered how far I could walk during Lent. Using the internet, I checked how far it is from John O'Groats to Salisbury, approx. 660 miles; when I divided that by 15 miles (the distance I think I could manage each day) it came up as 44 days (Lent having 40 or 46 days, depending on if you count Sundays). And then suddenly the mad idea of doing a sponsored walk of John O'Groats to Salisbury was born.


The other thing which has affected me is listening to the voices of refugees on the radio and reflecting on the distances they have to walk to try to find safety. They don't have a choice, but I do.

#### What's the Big Idea? -

#### An Introduction to the Books of the Old Testament

#### **Proverbs**

The Book of Proverbs is an anthology of sayings ('mishle') that are generally attributed to Solomon (Proverbs 1:1), who uttered 3000 proverbs (1Kings 4:32). The purpose of these oracles is 'for attaining wisdom and discipline' (1:2). Solomon was concerned that people, especially the young, would understand 'the sayings and riddles of the wise.' (1:3-6). His guiding principle is that 'The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge.' (1:7).

To give an idea of the recurring themes in the book, here are a few examples:

Knowing God: 'The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding' (9:10).

Guarding Our Speech: 'A word aptly spoken is like apples of gold in settings of silver' (25:11).

Marital faithfulness: 'May your fountain be blessed and may you rejoice in the wife of your youth' (5:15-20).

Our Work: 'Go to the ant, you sluggard; consider its ways and be wise!' (6:6-11).

Dangers of Strong Drink: 'Wine is a mocker and beer a brawler; whoever is led astray by them is not wise' (20:1).

Justice and Honesty: 'The LORD abhors dishonest scales, but accurate weights are His delight' (11:1).

Underlying these sayings is a conviction about God's omniscience, 'For a man's ways are in full view of the LORD, and He examines all his paths' (5:21); providence, 'Many are the plans in a man's heart, but it is the LORD's purpose that prevails' (19:21) and goodness, 'The LORD is far from the wicked but He hears the prayer of the righteous' (15:29).

Proverbs reminds us that God is concerned with the way we live today. 'Wisdom is the art of living skilfully in whatever actual conditions we find ourselves' (Eugene Peterson).

#### Date for your diary

#### LAMENTATIONS for Nakba Day Thursday 15th May 7pm for 7.30pm

We welcome to All Saints Church Rev Canon Jonathan Herbert, Hammadi Charif, Miranda Pinch, Rev Hilary Bond and the Dean of Salisbury to lead reflections on the Nakba of 1948 and subsequent events in Israel Palestine.

Miranda's mother was a secular Jewish refugee from the Holocaust in 1938 who was always bitterly opposed to what was being done to the Palestinians in her name as a Jew. Miranda travelled in the occupied territories of Palestine at the end of last year and will be telling us some of what she witnessed.

If you were moved by the *Christ under the Rubble* Christmas Tree at St Thomas's Church in December, whether or not you have heard the Dean speak about his time as an Ecumenical Accompanier in East Jerusalem, or if you want to know more about the Nakba then you will be very welcome.

### Final report of Archbishops' Commission for Racial Justice published

The Archbishops' Commission for Racial Justice (ACRJ) has published its sixth and final report. It was charged with monitoring, and supporting the implementation of the 47 recommendations of the Archbishops' Anti-Racism Taskforce.

The report calls for the church to address the "gaping wound of racial injustice that afflicts it" and to "reach out and welcome all comers".

It says that a strategy for bringing about change has not yet been adopted at all the front lines of the Church. The Commission identifies four priorities as key to further progress:

- Nurturing a worship culture in the Church of England that reflects the rich mix of backgrounds present within the Church today.
- The need for a robust structure of governance to ensure racial justice becomes a normal part of practice.
- The need for an effective complaints system.
- That the barriers to full participation for all within the C of E are addressed

The Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell said: "The proposed priorities are achievable, and I and my fellow Bishops are committed to ensuring that we drive forward the change and progress needed to eradicate racial injustice within the Church, and march into the light of God."

#### All in the month of April

#### It was:

150 years ago, on 17<sup>th</sup> April 1875 that the game of snooker was invented by Neville Chamberlain, a British army officer stationed in India.

80 years ago, on 30<sup>th</sup> April 1945 that Adolf Hitler, Austrian-born German Nazi Party Leader, Chancellor of Germany (1933-45) and dictator (1934-45) committed suicide along with his wife, Eva Braun.

70 years ago, on 5<sup>th</sup> April 1955 that Prime Minister Winston Churchill announced his retirement because of failing health. He was succeeded by Anthony Eden on 7<sup>th</sup> April.

65 years ago, on 1st April 1960 that Dr Martens boots went on sale in the UK.

50 years ago, on 4<sup>th</sup> April 1975 that Microsoft, the computer software/hardware company, was founded by Bill Gates and Paul Allen in Albuquerque New Mexico.

Also 50 years ago, on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1975 that US President Gerald Ford gave a televised speech in which he announced that the USA's involvement in the Vietnam war was over, and all US aid to South Vietnam had ended. The war itself ended on 30<sup>th</sup> April, when North Vietnamese forces captured the South Vietnamese capital Saigon.

40 years ago, on 21<sup>st</sup> April 1985 that Brazilian racing driver Ayrton Senna won the Portuguese Grand Prix. It was the first of his 41 Formula One wins.

Also 40 years ago, on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1985 that the Coca-Cola Company changed the formula of Coca-Cola and launched it on the market as New Coke. The public were out-raged, and the original formula was restored within three months.

30 years ago, on 4<sup>th</sup> April 1995 that Kenny Everett, DJ, comedian and TV entertainer, died. Known for his zany humour, characters and sketches.

25 years ago, on 12<sup>th</sup> April 2000 that Queen Elizabeth II awarded the Royal Ulster Constabulary the George Cross in recognition of its collective and sustained bravery during the Troubles in Northern Ireland.

Also 25 years ago, on 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2000 that the 'The Big Number' change took place on the UK's telephone system. Many area codes were updated or replaced, and new ones created for mobile, freephone, local rate, national rate, and premium rate services.

20 years ago, on 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2005 that Pope John Paul II died. Succeeded by Pope Benedict XVI on 19<sup>th</sup> April.

Also 20 years ago, on 9<sup>th</sup> April 2005 that Charles, Prince of Wales, married Camilla Parker Bowles, who gained the title the Duchess of Cornwall.

10 years ago, on 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2015 that the Gorkha earthquake took place in Nepal. Nearly 9,000 people were killed, 22,000 injured, and 3.5 million made homeless.


