




Diocesan context of attendance





The Accounts show that the parish had a general deficit of £5,537 (2022: deficit of £13,750).

This excludes the impact of the revaluation of investments and an endowed Freehold property.

The overall general fund deficit was £10,405 (2022: deficit of £4,868 after adjusting for Hall capitalised expenditure in the general fund).

Reserves

The PCC retains a range of unrestricted, restricted and endowment funds which are described in notes 9 to 11 to the financial statements. The general reserve fund is held to cover the PCC's day to day activities.

Guidance from the Church of England and the Charity Commission, encourages the PCC to have a reserves policy of 3 months recurring costs, or £40,000, currently being provided by the restricted funds for repairs & improvements on the Churches.

At the end of 2023, the Parish General Reserve amounted to a deficit of £10,405 with no further reserves or working capital. This has led to a practical cash deficit of approximately £40,000.

The PCC will endeavour to remedy this by general fundraising, a review of parish decision making, priorities and financial controls.

This will include

new expenditure procedures
a detailed annual budget with cost savings
income targets
a three year plan to attempt to boost unrestricted funds





What does this mean?

Pause on hall development and fundraising

Harnham Parish is very grateful to all our generous supporters who have enabled us to make such wonderful improvements to the Parish Hall over the last few years.

All our users can now enjoy our brilliant catering-grade kitchen, environmentally friendly and very effective underfloor heating system, asbestos-free, insulated ceiling and LED lighting in the Main Hall, a well-lit car park, and newly covered hall roof.

Due to greatly increased building costs, high energy costs and other rising costs over the past few years, the Parochial Church Council has taken the decision to pause the Transformation Project and refocus, for an interim period of time, on a programme to smarten up the exterior of the Hall and the site as a whole, and to maximise the use of the existing building by and for the Harnham community.

All our supporters are encouraged to help us promote the building to potential hirers, particularly for weekend parties and events.

The Parochial Church Council remains committed to our longer-term vision to transform the building into Harnham Hub, as a centre of activity and outreach for the whole community of Harnham.

PCC has identified Financial priorities

- 1. Ensure that there is a balance in fundraising between restricted and general income Hall management, Hall Development. PCC.
- **2. Reduce expenditure** Communications, Admin, Worship, Eco church committee.
- **3. Increase income** Stewardship with Vicar, Treasurer and Planned giving secretary. PCC focus on increasing income. Churchwardens and Congregation focus on raising income. Grant searches for specific purposes and a specific fundraising group.
- **4. Maximise Hall use / income and marketing potential** Hall Management committee, Communications Committee.
- **5. Hall maintenance and renovation plan** Hall Transformation Committee.
- **6. Training in finance for PCC members.** PCC members, Diocese.

Most of our regular income comes from the church family. Thank you.

Giving regularly means we are better able to plan for the year and the future.

 The best and most secure method of paying is via Parish Giving Scheme. If you still give via envelopes, or 'normal' direct debit, you could change to PGS. It means we can claim gift aid much easier and have regular income.
