October is Black History Month.

Saint Josephine Margaret Bakhita. 1869-1847. Josephine was kidnapped by slave traders in Sudan at the age of only seven. Her name then was Bakhita, meaning Lucky. Alongside another young girl, they hatched a plan to run away from the slave market. They did so but became lost in the wilderness. She believed a guardian angel guided them to safety. However, they were then caught by another slave trader and spent 12 years as slaves. She won her freedom with the help of the Canossian sisters and was baptised.

She once said, 'Seeing the sun, the moon and stars by night, I said to myself Who could be the Master of all these beautiful things? And I felt a great desire to know him and pay him homage.'

She was always loving and kind, and even stated that if she met her slave owners she would forgive them.
