From the Vicarage

Dear friends



MID POINT

'You are half way through!' is a phrase often used in many live reality television programmes such as Masterchef, or the Sewing Bee or the Great British Bake Off! Contestants note the timing, check their check lists, ovens, recipes or garment patterns and plan ahead for the rest of the time efficiently so there is no last-minute panic!

June is halfway through the year. Originally named after the ancient Roman goddess of marriage and childbirth, June is still a popular month for weddings! We have had many banns of marriage being called at our Sunday services as couples prepare for marriage. As part of the preparation, they not only plan for the service but explore their hopes for married life together. I often talk about how God is present in each of them, what the vows mean to them, and how they can help each other's gifts to grow. 'Thank you. I am really enjoying the depth of our discussions,' said one person to me recently, 'we talk about things that matter because we have set aside the time to.' I was very encouraged, and noted 'Yes, in the business of life, we can forget to stop and be there for each other. And on the wedding day it is good to have a mid point agreed when you both step back and look at what is happening, who is there to support you and pause with each other.'

Jesus often stepped aside mid-business of life to pray or ventured to the middle of the lake, to reflect. Perhaps you could say, to find an equilibrium - a state in which opposing forces or influences are balanced. The needs of the people he served, and his own need to rest and enjoy God.

Most communities of holy people set a mid point in the day as a call to prayer, to reset their equilibrium, balancing the rhythms of work, rest and worship.

Why not set aside a mid point in your day to use this prayer during June? It comes from the Northumbria community.



You are members of God's family. And because you belong to him, you too are being built together. You are being made into a house where God lives through his spirit. Ephesians 2:19,22.

Our annual Soup and Sweets lunch was held at the end of May to raise funds for the work of the Mothers' Union overseas. Those present enjoyed a choice of soups and a sumptuous array of sweets. The hall was filled with much chatter and laughter as people enjoyed the chance to catch up with friends and neighbours over lunch. The sum of more than £285 was raised and rounding this up from funds will enable the sum of £300 to be sent for overseas work.

Supporting families and women this work abroad is driven by prioritising the end of poverty, violence and social injustice. A number of projects are funded in areas of East, Central and Southern Africa.

As an example, in one of these projects an area is given two goats, two pigs and a pair of ducks. With help they are able to progress from feeding just three families to whole communities. The meat, eggs and milk from the livestock provides food to sustain them and an income to keep children in school. In just a short time they are able to lift themselves out of poverty. The money is certainly put to very good use for the benefit of the communities.





ECO CHURCH

I trust some of you were able to take part in the 'Big Plastic Count', and you have now received the results. However, for those of you who have not seen the results, I share them with you now.

Over 224,000 people took part, and it is from their data that the following facts have been produced: - **1.7 billion pieces of plastic are thrown away in a week in the UK.** This means that we throw away more plastic per person than every country in the world except for the US.

Being the second largest producer of plastic waste looks like this:-

- **14% is exported**/dumped in other countries with poorer recycling infrastructure than in the UK.
- **11% is sent to landfill**, but this is getting very expensive, so more is incinerated.
- **58% is being burnt.** BUT incinerators release toxic gases, which pollute the air we all breath. In 2022 we burnt 46%.
- **17% is recycled.** But our recycling systems can't cope with the amount of plastic. Also, we all know that there is still a lot of plastic which cannot be recycled. Thirdly, the recycling process releases microplastics into our air and water, which defeats the very problem it is meant to address.

I believe we are all agreed that the only way to reduce our plastic waste problem is to reduce it at its very source. Fortunately, some governments have started negotiations requesting a 'Global Plastics Treaty', which will set global targets to reduce plastic production by at least 75% by 2040.

There is always hope, remember in 2023, the Global Oceans Treaty with the aim to protect 30% of our oceans by 2030.

Let us in Harnham continue to work to reduce the amount of plastic we bring into our homes, then throw away.

Summary of the Annual Parish Meeting of Harnham Parish Churches held on 26th May

There is a lot to celebrate this year. In 2023 we **Enjoyed** Hub Fest, Music Festival Month, Fun Day and Fete, Pet Festival, Coronation Celebrations, Visit from a Chelsea Pensioner and two Quiz nights.

We have **Experienced** Life Recovery Course, Bereavement Course, Open Churches, A search for and growth in faith, Places of reflection and peace, Membership of groups, Support and kindness such as through the hall user groups- Alzheimer's support, U3A, toddlers, Worship, Talks and sermons topics, Messy Church fun and worship, The Archbishop of Canterbury's visit.

We have **Engaged** with the community through Community teas, Coronation weekend celebrations, Bereavement Courses, Festival lunches, Discretionary fund visits with food, Soup runs for the homeless, Harnham Junior School support alongside Parent Support Officers, Pop Up workshops for families, Music Sunday choir and Christmas Carol choir, Delivery of posies at Harvest and Mothering Sunday, Volunteering with HCN coffee and chat, Harvest Table, Ecumenical Creationtide prayer walk for climate action.

The **opening of the Parish Churches** on a daily basis, has had many positive comments -

Arizona, Australia (Sydney) Barbados, Birmingham, British Columbia, California, Cheshire, Christchurch, Cornwall, Devon, Dumfries, East Sussex, Fareham, Florida USA, Guernsey, Hilparton March, Ickenham, Light water, Lincolnshire, Liphook, Maine, Nether wallop, New Galloway, Newport, New Zealand, North Carolina and Oregon USA, Oxfordshire, Pewsey, Reading, Somerset, Sweden, The Netherlands, Truro and HARNHAM!

Priorities identified by the PCC in the year and moving forward are

- a) Worship that enables all ages, newcomers and long-standing Christians and draws on our strengths of inclusivity, range of approaches, pastoral care, creativity and music, and uses social media. Pastoral care for all in the community as we can provide.
- b) Engage well with younger people in Harnham.

- c) Finance that supports a flourishing church. Ensure the budget prioritises churches and young people. Refocus on the best use of equipment we have; fundraising focussed on general income; reduction of costs
- d) Buildings for best use, remain open for the community and the hall is marketed well. Ecological awareness.
- e) Continue to explore Diocesan Vision to enable our vision.

The PCC has also agreed that in order to rebalance finance we will:

Ensure that there is a balance in fundraising between restricted and general income. Our restricted income has raised more money than our general income, especially with a focus on the hall fundraising. Our general income needs a boost. In order to get the right balance between restricted funds and general income, with the right amount of reserves the PCC has agreed that several actions need to take place. **This means that there will be a Pause to the hall development into a hub.** Harnham Parish is very grateful to all our generous supporters who have enabled us to make such wonderful improvements to the Parish Hall over the last few years. All our users can now enjoy our brilliant catering-grade kitchen, environmentally friendly and very effective underfloor heating system, asbestos-free, insulated ceiling and LED lighting in the Main Hall, a well-lit car park, and newly covered hall roof.

Due to greatly increased building costs, high energy costs and other rising costs over the past few years, the Parochial Church Council has taken the decision to pause the Transformation Project and refocus, for an interim period of time, on a programme to smarten up the exterior of the Hall and the site as a whole, and to maximise the use of the existing building by and for the Harnham community. All our supporters are encouraged to help us promote the building to potential hirers, particularly for weekend parties and events.

The Parochial Church Council remains committed to our longer-term vision for a Harnham Hub, as a centre of activity and outreach for the whole community of Harnham.

There will be maximised Hall use and income and the hall will be marketed. We have much opportunity for bookings at weekends. Many people use the hall space to host family parties, christening parties, special birthday parties and even wedding receptions. Why not try it?!

There will be a Hall maintenance and renovation plan in order to repaint doors, and some interior upgrades of the toilets and entrance areas. If you could lend a hand that would be greatly appreciated. The outside will continue to be cared for by a working party. We hope that you have noticed the amount of work completed on the removal of ivy from the fences adjoining the field and lane.

PCC members will continue to be trained in finance.

There will also be reductions in expenditure. As magazine readers you will notice that there will be less colour printing and the cost of the magazine will increase to cover all expenses.

In order to increase income, grant searches will be made for specific purposes and a specific fundraising group will continue. If you are experienced in **fundraising** and would like to help please contact Charles Woodd. 01722 323447.

Robert Salkeld was re-elected as Churchwarden of All Saints. Julie Scott is the new Treasurer appointed in April this year. 3 new PCC members were elected- Debbie Musselwhite, Inas Miles and Jane Greenaway. 1 new Deanery Synod member was elected.

Thank yous. There are so many people who enable our churches to flourish. My thanks go to all people in front and behind the scenes. Particular thanks we expressed to Charles Woodd, for his service as Churchwarden, Pam Pointer who stepped back from writing for the magazine after many years, and Revd Mike Badger who finishes his curacy this year.

All in the month of June

It was:

200 years ago, on 16th June 1824, that a London vicar, Arthur Broome, and some 22 of his friends, including the MPs William Wilberforce (anti-slavery campaigner) met at Old Slaughters Coffee House to found the SPCA - the first national animal protection society in the world. By 1840 Queen Victoria had given permission for it to be called the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

125 years ago, on 19th June 1899 that Anglo-Egyptian Sudan was established. It was granted independence in 1956 as the Republic of Sudan. South Sudan gained its independence in 2011. On 15th April 2023, violent clashes erupted between the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) in Sudan, resulting in the displacement of more than 8.6 million people. There are currently about 25 million people in need of aid in Sudan.

100 years ago, on 8th June 1924 that George Mallory, British mountaineer, disappeared on Mount Everest. His body was found in 1999.

80 years ago, on 6th June 1944 that D-Day and the Normandy Landings took place. More than 150,000 Allied troops landed on the beaches of Normandy. The Battle of Normandy ended on 25th August. Allied victory.

Also 80 years ago, on 13th June 1944 that Germany launched the first V-1 flying bomb ('doodlebug') attack on London. 9,521 V-1s were fired at London and south-east England during the war.

75 years ago, on 8th June 1949 that George Orwell's novel *Nineteen Eighty-Four* was published.

70 years ago, on 7th June 1954 that Alan Turing, British mathematician, logician, cryptanalyst, and computer scientist died. Considered the father of theoretical computer science and artificial intelligence. Prosecuted for his homosexuality.

60 years ago, on 4th June 1964 that the Beatles' first world tour was held. Over two months they played 30 concerts in seven countries, beginning in Copenhagen.

50 years ago, on 28th June 1974 that chemists at the University of California, Irvine, published the first report that warned that chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) could damage the Earth's ozone layer.

30 years ago, on 6th June 1994 that the highest individual score in first-class cricket was achieved. Brian Lara scored 501 not out while playing for Warwickshire against Durham. It is the only score of 500 or more in first-class cricket history.

15 years ago, on 25th June 2009 that Michael Jackson 'the King of Pop', American singer, songwriter, and dancer, died of an anaesthetic overdose, aged 50.

What's the Big Idea? - An Introduction to the Books of the Old Testament.

RUTH

The book of Ruth is a story of God's grace operating in difficult circumstances, during the period of the Judges. It unfolds as a four-act drama, telling the story of how Naomi, her husband and two sons left Judah for Moab, where her sons married. When Naomi's husband and sons died, she returns to Bethlehem in Judah.

In the first act, Naomi tells her Moabite daughters-in-law, Orpah and Ruth, to stay in Moab. However, Ruth refuses to leave Naomi and accompanies her to Bethlehem (chapter 1). In the next act Ruth meets Boaz, a relative of Naomi, while gathering barley in his fields (chapter 2).

The third act takes place at the threshing floor where Boaz is asleep and Ruth lies at his feet. She expresses her desire to marry him, as her kinsman-redeemer. But Boaz tells her of another prior claim (chapter 3). Finally, at the city gate, the other relative renounces his claim, and Boaz marries Ruth (chapter 4).

In Ruth's story we see God's unseen hand directing the lives of the characters to accomplish his purpose e.g. '*Naomi returned from Moab accompanied by Ruth, arriving in Bethlehem as the barley harvest was beginning*' (1:22). He transforms Naomi's sorrow into joy, rewarding Ruth with a place of honour in Israel's history. In Boaz, we see a foreshadowing of the work of Jesus Christ, as he pays the price to secure Ruth's future.

'In its artful telling of this 'outsider' widow, uprooted and obscure, who turns out to be the great-grandmother of David and the ancestor of Jesus, the book of Ruth makes it possible for each of us to understand ourselves, however ordinary, as irreplaceable in the full telling of God's story.' (Eugene Peterson).




