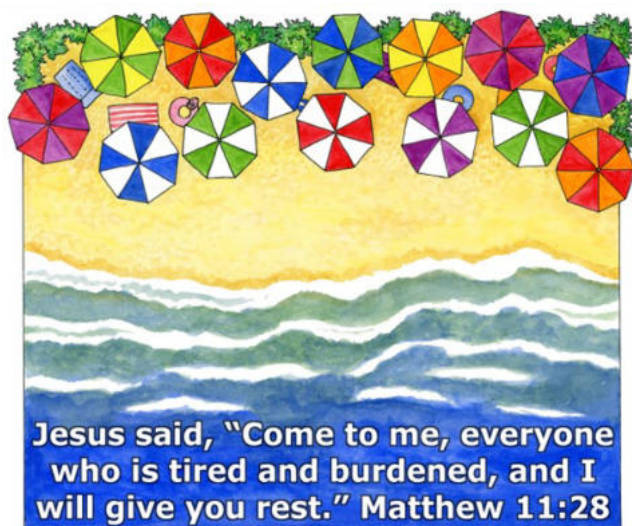

Dear Friends.

This month as we (hopefully) enjoy some warm, sunny weather, our thoughts may turn to picnics and barbecues, which will almost certainly include some bread amongst the spread.

Who doesn't enjoy the smell of fresh bread? Researchers have shown that the aroma of baked bread is associated with comfort, happiness and safety. This association means that when we smell fresh-baked bread it automatically gives us an overall 'good' feeling.

Bread is one of the world's oldest prepared foods and it has both cultural and religious significance. The majority of bread is made with wheat, which itself is considered to be one of the world's staple foods. Archaeological evidence suggests that wheat was first cultivated around 9600BC and recently new excavations at Pompeii have shown evidence of a commercial bakery operated in the city by slaves. Bread has been an essential part of human history and was significant in the formation of early human societies. It's a staple food across cultures, representing sustenance, nourishment, and life itself.

Bread plays a powerful part throughout the story of God's people so it's not surprising that Jesus described himself as the 'Bread of Life'. Jesus came to provide 'bread' that satisfies more than physical hunger. He is the bread God gives, the one who comes to give life to the world so that those who believe in him will never be hungry.

As we enter August, combine harvesters will already (weather permitting) have been at work in our local fields cutting winter wheat and now the harvesting of spring wheat will begin. It seems appropriate then, that August 1st marks Lammas or 'Loaf-mass' which is a traditional English feast of thanksgiving for the first-fruits of the wheat harvest.

Traditionally, a newly baked loaf from the wheat harvest was presented before God at mass on that day and the loaf used as the consecrated bread. Although the ceremony stopped at the Reformation, the practice has been revived in some places in more recent years. Tradition also dictates that the Lammas loaf should ideally be baked by members of the congregation, using local produce wherever possible.

So next time you enjoy a slice of the humble loaf, have a thought for bread's historical and spiritual significance. Give thanks for all those people who have played a part in its production from wheat seed to the delicious finished product, remembering too all those people across our world who continue to live in hunger.

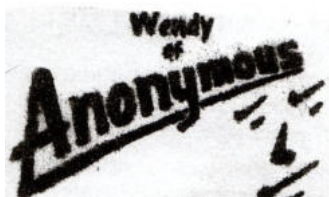

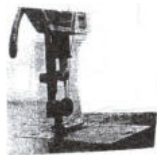

ECO CHURCH

There is HOPE

We all know we are in a race against time, and by 2030 we must reduce our CO emissions by over 40 percent, and protect 30 percent of nature, fresh water and oceans. The good news is that in December 2019 Prince William announced the 'Earthshot Prize', and in October 2020 with David Attenborough they launched the project with a prize to be given to five individuals or organisations each year. These are individuals, who are prepared to use their talent, time and ingenuity for creating solutions for the world's greatest environmental challenges.

Earthshot prize has five goals,

1. Protect and restore nature, so the natural world is growing and not shrinking.
2. Clean our air, thus ensuring everyone breaths clean air at WHO standards.
3. Revive our oceans, both repairing and preserving our oceans.
4. Build a waste free world, with no wastage, where leftovers can become the raw materials for another process.
5. Fix our climate, by cutting our carbon, and building a carbon- neutral economy.

One of the finalists who has seen incredible growth in the impact of their project is 'Mukuru Clean Stoves'. It is Charlot Magayi's story. Charlot grew up in Mukuru, a large slum in Nairobi, Kenya, where, for years, to make a living, she sold charcoal for fuel. Unfortunately, the charcoal was the cause of the numerous respiratory infections both she and her neighbours suffered, then in 2012 her daughter was severely burnt by the charcoal burning stove. This unfortunate event, promoted Charlot to search for another way, and so it was she discovered Mukuru Clean Stoves. These stoves, instead of burning dangerous solid fuels, use processed biomass made from charcoal, wood and sugarcane. These stoves are cleaner, creating 90 percent less pollution, which is less than an open fire and 70 percent less than a traditional cook stove. Also, they are cheaper, and use half the ongoing fuel costs.

Today, 200,000 people in Kenya use Mukuru Clean Stoves, saving \$10 million in fuel costs and saving lives too. In rural areas, where young girls often spend three hours a day collecting firewood, they save precious time. This is a female-founded business with predominantly female staff and distribution agents. Mukuru is empowering women to make a living by making a difference.

Charlot plans to create an even cleaner stove that burns ethanol. In three years, she hopes to reach one million customers. In ten years, she plans to reach ten million people all over Africa.

If you are interested I can share more such stories.

What gardening can do for your brain

People who spend time gardening may have better brain function in later life than those who do not.

Such are the findings of a recent study at the University of Edinburgh.

The authors of the study observe that gardening involves: “not only physical exertion but creativity and planning. Engaging in gardening projects, learning about plants, and general garden upkeep, involve complex cognitive processes such as memory and executive function.”

“Consistent with the ‘use it or lose it’ framework of cognitive function, more engagement in gardening may be directly associated with a lower risk of cognitive decline.”

As one doctor said: “People often don’t realise the wide range of benefits that gardening can bring. For example, digging, planting and pulling weeds will increase hand strength, which research has shown can also boost brain health.”

“Growing your own food can help you eat a healthier diet; another key factor. And staying connected to other people is beneficial for brain health, so community allotments are a great place to socialise, reducing loneliness and isolation.”

The researchers want more study into the possible benefits of gardening, hoping it might help against cognitive decline.

What's the Big Idea?

An Introduction to the Books of the Old Testament'

1 & 2 Kings

1 & 2 Kings is a single literary work telling the history of Israel's monarchy from the end of David's reign until the Babylonian exile following the fall of Jerusalem (586 BC). After Solomon's reign, Israel was divided into two kingdoms: Israel to the north and Judah in the south. In the north 20 rulers reigned over 210 years until the fall of Samaria (722 BC). In the southern kingdom there were also 20 rulers, spanning a period of 345 years.

This account is not like reading a modern history book. The author views the story through the lens of God's relationship with His people. The welfare of Israel depended on their leaders' trust and obedience in God, e.g. Solomon building the Temple, as well as listening to the prophets e.g. Elijah and Elisha. The kings who receive the most attention are those whose disobedience is greatest (e.g. Ahab and Manasseh) or those who truly follow God (eg. Hezekiah and Josiah).

The book ends with exile in Babylon, fulfilling God's warning of the consequences of disobedience for both kingdoms (cf Dt 28:64–68). However, this doesn't mean that there is no hope for the future. At the end of the book, Jehoiachin is released from prison in Babylon, and he is given a place of honour (2 Kings 25:27-30). The future remains open for God to fulfill His promises to the house of David.

'We begin to realise that if God's sovereignty is never cancelled out by the so deeply sin-flawed leaders ('kings') in both our culture and our church, we can quite cheerfully exult in God's sovereignty as it is being exercised in all the circumstantial details of the actual present.' (E Peterson).

For your information

It has been suggested by one of our parishioners that something should be put in the magazine to raise awareness of the bowel cancer screening service provided by the NHS.

Everyone aged 60 to 74 years who is registered with a GP and lives in England is automatically sent an NHS bowel cancer screening kit every 2 years. The programme is expanding so that everyone aged 50 to 59 years will be eligible for screening. This is happening gradually over 4 years and started in April 2021 with 56 year olds.

The programme has also started to include 58 year olds, so you may get a test before you're 60. Make sure your GP practice has your correct address so your kit is posted to the right place.

If you're 75 or over, you can ask for a kit every 2 years by phoning the free bowel cancer screening helpline on 0800 707 60 60.

All in the month of August

It was:

90 years ago, on 19th August 1934 that in a referendum in Germany, voters approved the creation of the position of 'Führer', which combined the roles of Chancellor and President into one and gave Adolf Hitler sole power.

80 years ago, on 1st August 1944 that 15-year-old Jewish diarist Anne Frank made the final entry in her diary while hiding from the Nazis in Amsterdam. On 4th August her hiding place was raided by Nazi police following a tip-off. She and her family were taken to Auschwitz concentration camp, and she was transferred to Belsen in October. She died in February 1945.

Also 80 years ago, on 25th August 1944 that Paris was liberated from the Nazis. The Germans had occupied the city for four years. General Charles de Gaulle (later President of France) entered the city in triumph.

75 years ago, on 24th August 1949 that the North Atlantic Treaty came into effect, establishing NATO.

65 years ago, on 7th August 1959 that the USA launched the Explorer 6 satellite, which sent back the first images of the Earth from space.

Also 65 years ago, on 21st August 1959 that Hawaii became the 50th state of the USA.

30 years ago, on 28th August 1994 that Sunday trading was legalised in England and Wales.

Also 30 years ago, on 31st August 1994 that the IRA agreed to a complete ceasefire after 25 years.

25 years ago, on 16th August 1999 that Vladimir Putin became Prime Minister of Russia. He became President in May 2000.

20 years ago, on 11th August 2004 that Britain issued its first license for cloning human embryos, after becoming the first country in the world to allow therapeutic cloning in 2001. They created their first cloned human embryo in May 2005.

15 years ago, on 20th August 2009 that Libyan intelligence officer Abdelbaset al-Megrahi, who was convicted of the bombing of Pan Am Flight 103 which crashed onto Lockerbie, Scotland in December 1988, was released from prison on compassionate grounds after being diagnosed with terminal cancer.

10 years ago, on 24th August 2014 that Richard Attenborough, Lord Attenborough, died. This British film actor and director was best known for his roles in *Brighton Rock*, *The Great Escape*, *Jurassic Park*, and *Miracle on 34th Street*. He directed films including *Oh! What A Lovely War!*, *A Bridge too Far*, *Cry Freedom* and *Gandhi*.

Fearless in the line of fire

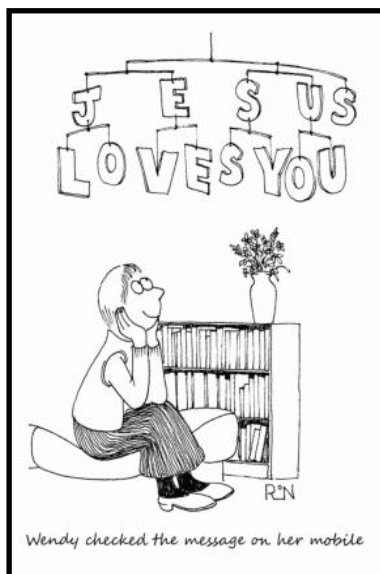
